Karen Lee 640-5804 to give her a count as to how many are coming. This is for food count and seating. There will be a 50/50 drawing.

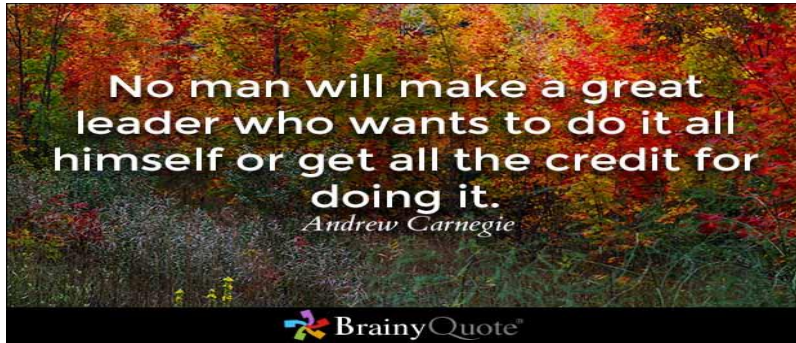

### **Recycling**

The Cheyenne City Sanitation Department is asking city residents to bag their recycling materials to help prevent items from blowing away.

Residents can use either a plastics bag between 15 and 30 gallons or a large paper bag. The bag can then be placed in recycling container.

They encourage to bag recycling material through March 31.

---Please bring all used **batteries** to the meeting to be recycled. Do not discard them in the trash. Phyllis Salzburg will be collecting them.

Prescription medicines can be taken to the Police Station to be disposed of.

### **Glass can be recycled at two locations:**

WYCO 2600 Missile Dr -Glass **must** be separated clear glass from colored glass. All glass containers will be accepted including beer and wine bottles. Other types of glass will not be accepted, like automotive glass, windows and light bulbs
