Laramie Woman's Club is accepting applications for the Mary Godat Bellamy Scholarship. The scholarship will benefit a non-traditional Albany County, Wyoming, resident age 18 or older that is currently attending or will be attending a Wyoming university, college, or licensed and accredited technical, vocational, or trade school during the 2024-2025 academic year. A non-traditional applicant must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Did not attend an institution of higher learning immediately upon completion of high school or after obtaining a GED, but may currently be enrolled, OR
- Withdrew from an institution of higher learning before receiving a diploma or

certification from the institution for any reason.

The amount of the Mary Godat Bellamy scholarship for the 2024-2025 academic year will be \$1,000. INTERFAITH - Interfaith is still accepting spices, egg cartons (unless you'd like to donate your cartons to the Clark chickens of Jana and Jennifer Clark, our members), non-perishable food items, travel size soap/shampoo/lotions and monetary donations. The money donated is used to purchase items from Food Bank of the Rockies which is only open to non-profit food organizations. Interfaith can buy large quantities of items through the Food Bank, for much cheaper than any local grocery store sale.

They are <u>not</u> accepting pill bottles at this time.

Josh Watanabe, Director, recently stated that Interfaith doubled the numbers of clients helped when they moved to their current location by LaBonte Park a few years ago. The food pantry averages 2000 visits per month and is open to anyone in the community. During the recent 2023 holiday season of Thanksgiving and Christmas, 750 households were served through the Interfaith Holiday Program. This program is based on income.

Interfaith helps an average of 3500 people each month through their housing, food and assistance programs. Thank-you for your help!

STUDENT SUPPORT TEAM (formerly School Success) - This program addresses the needs of homeless students in Albany County. Lisa Theis (sounds like 'dice' but with a 't') is the Liaison for the school district. You can contact her (at the Middle School, 721-4430) if you have household items, or furniture

to donate. They are always looking for kitchen items, gently used furniture, clothing and hygiene items.

Also, this time of year, hats, gloves, gently used outerwear are appreciated. Travel size deodorants for either gender are needed as well as regular size shampoo/conditioner/ lotions of any kind are useful. New socks, underwear of any size and color are also helpful. You can bring your donations to the meeting and we'll make sure they are delivered to Lisa. These students are working hard to get their education despite circumstances that are beyond their control, so our efforts make a big difference in their lives. Thank-you.

<u>CAN TABS</u> - Please keep saving your can tabs, our goal is 20 pounds which helps families at the Ronald McDonald House in Denver.
